### Employment History

Chief Executive Officer – Eco2 (& Eco2 Management Services Ltd)  
November 2002 to Date

Eco2 is a Cardiff based, privately owned company but was formed by Economy Power (Wales' fastest growing company for 2003 with annual growth of 10,000%). I was appointed by EP to start a new renewable energy business, principally based on wind and biomass throughout Europe.

During 2006 I led a £100m financing of its renewable energy portfolio which coincided with the formation of a new Eco2 company. In the early years sold our interests in wind and landfill gas in combined deals worth approximately £45million.

I successfully developed, financed and built Wales' first commercial scale biomass project at Port Talbot with a novel funding combination of ethical investment equity, Project Finance, European and DTI grants. Since 2011 I have raised over £0.8 Billion in respect of three Straw Fired Power Stations and two Waste Wood Power Stations in England and Wales.

From a £4m investment and under my management, Eco2 has raised over £1Bn in funding and returned approaching £120m to Shareholders in capital gains without selling any shares in Eco2 and without needing any corporate debt.

Eco2 has a spin off company Eco2 Management Services which manages power projects on behalf of its owners including the fuel supply (where applicable). This company manages the delivery of over 1 million tonnes per annum of biomass to time and cost including approximately 160 lorry deliveries per day. The company has a turnover of circa £4m and is profitable with earnings of £700k per annum.

Utility Partnership Limited - Interim Managing Director  
June 2002 to November 2002

Wales' fastest growing company for 2002 and fifth in the UK with annual growth of 8000%. I was appointed to restructure the business and put in place business systems to cope with the high growth. UPL at the time was an Infrastructure Consultancy Business principally operating in the Mobile Telecommunications Market. The Shareholders offered me a permanent post at the end of my tenure but I decided to join Economy Power instead.

Energy Power Resources - Chief Executive  
May 1996 to June 2002 (Also Chairman of Anglian Straw Ltd, EPR Ely Limited and EPR Scotland Limited)

I secured £28 million of Venture Capital funding in February 1998 to start EPR from my home in Newport. EPR became the UK's largest generator of renewable energy during 2004/5 and Europe's largest Biomass generator. During my time at EPR I financed the World's largest Straw fired and the World's first fluidised bed poultry litter power stations. I also led the negotiations to acquire First Renewables/Fibrowatt during 2001/02.

Through my management, turnover grew from zero to £50 million per annum in three years. EPR presently has over 100MW of live capacity and employs over 200 people as a consequence of the organic growth and acquisitions I led prior to departure. It also developed the Riverside Energy from Waste project on the Thames in East London which was the UK's largest Energy from Waste Plant. It also developed projects in Holland and the USA. EPR was sold to Macquarie in 2002 for in excess of £200m four years after raising the start-up finance. For the period 2002 to 2006 it owned all of the UK's commercial operational biomass capacity moving over 1Mt of biomass annually.

#### South Wales Electricity (SWALEC)

##### Director and Generation Projects Manager 1994-1996

Responsible for development of new electricity generation projects and company representative on joint venture Boards as well as a Board Member of South Wales Power Limited and the management of operational projects in the portfolio.

I was also a member of the SWALEC plc Corporate Strategy Team and the nominated Director on the Board of the British Wind Energy Association.

Also responsible for the establishment of the SWALEC combined heat and power business.

#### South Wales Electricity

##### Business Development Manager – Renewables (1993-1994)

Tasked with starting a renewable energy business. Through the negotiation of strategic joint ventures I made SWALEC one of the leading developers of renewable energy. Successfully developed and built windfarms, landfill gas, hydro powered and oil fired power stations through joint venture arrangements.

The landfill gas business I started is now one of the largest in the country and became United Utilities Green Energy.

Responsible for the successful award of around £170 million of renewable energy contracts.

##### Generation Projects Engineer 1991 – 1993

Following the flotation of South Wales Electricity, it diversified into power generation. I was the first appointment responsible for due diligence of power station investments and advising on corporate strategy (including its diversification into renewable energy). During this time I advised on the investment potential of many gas fired power stations and was actively involved in Teesside Power which is a £800 million gas fired power station.
